

# Klondike Derby 2019

Hosted by Alpha Phi Omega – Phi Epsilon Chapter  
Maine Maritime Academy

Greetings Scouters,

It is nearly time for Klondike Derby again! We look forward to seeing you all again and making this year bigger and better than the last. The 2019 MMA Klondike Derby will be **Saturday, February 2nd, 2019**. There are two options to choose from regarding attendance.

## **OPTION 1:**

**Arrive Friday, February 1<sup>st</sup>, any time after 4:30 pm** to register and spend the night in the Fieldhouse. Remember to bring appropriate sleeping bags and pillows because the college does not permit camping outside. Enjoy our pool, utilize the basketball courts, or climb on the rock wall that Friday night when you arrive. In the morning, prior to the Klondike Derby, you will be provided breakfast on the Mess Deck.

## **OPTION 2:**

**Arrive Saturday, February 2<sup>nd</sup>, between 7:30 am – 8:30 am** to register. Please note that this option does not include breakfast at the Mess Deck or any time for other Maine Maritime Academy opportunities.

### **For both options the event includes**

- 1) Various scouting-related educational classes will be held Saturday morning (0845-1045) in (2) one-hour blocks.
- 2) The Race will be held on Saturday afternoon.
- 3) Patrols will break for lunch at 10:45am and everyone will head to a designated area where patrols will be able to start a small cooking fire and prepare a patrol lunch. This lunch will be a competition. The meals will be judged on nutrition, fire safety, Leave No Trace guidelines, creativity, and taste (please leave a small sample available). **ALL MEALS SHOULD BE PREPARED SOLELY BY THE SCOUTS. LUNCH IS A SCORED ITEM AND THE TIME IT TAKES THE TROOPS TO COMPLETE THE LUNCH WILL BE ADDED TO THE FINAL SCORE. POINTS WILL BE DEDUCTED FOR ADULT INVOLVEMENT.** The materials for this meal will be should be brought to the event by the troops, the event will not provide cooking materials or food items. Store bought pre-prepared food (take out, frozen pizza, etc.) will not be judged. There will only be 1 hour and 15 minutes for lunch, plan your meals accordingly.

**And to clear up any confusion, lunch is a scored event and counts toward the point totals for patrols. Patrols are responsible for finding the designated judges and getting their sign-offs.**

- 4) Sleds should be equipped with anything that may be needed. **Be Prepared!** No items will be provided at the stations, scouts should have anything needed within their sled, this includes a pen or pencil!  
A few items that are mandatory: orienteering compasses, sleeping bag/blankets, first aid kit, fire starting equipment (matches, flint & steel, bow drill, tinder, wood, etc.), extra water, warm clothes. See the Gear List for full details.
- 5) Saturday evening events will include the awards ceremony and access to the pool and rock wall, as well as scouting activities.
- 6) Sunday morning will consist of breakfast on the mess deck, followed by an optional tour of the campus.

#### **For the Derby:**

All scout patrol leaders will attend a briefing at 11:30 where any clarifying questions should be asked, once the event has started questions about scoring will not be answered. The Derby will start promptly at 12:00. Patrols will use their compass skills and orient their way from station to station. Teams do not have to go to stations in a specific order (allowing teams to move ahead should there be a long wait time), **however teams must complete each station before concluding the race and receiving their final time.** **All scouts must remain together for the entire race, if a scout is missing from a patrol, the team will not be able to compete at that station. THIS MEANS DO NOT SPLIT UP, DO NOT LEAVE SCOUTS BEHIND! The number of scouts in a patrol and their names will be taken at each station.** The Derby will officially end at 17:00 (all sleds must be out of the woods by then). The scouts will return to the Mess Deck for dinner and then the Fieldhouse where they will unpack and change into appropriate clothing. At 19:00 we will hold an awards ceremony in Delano Auditorium. After the awards are distributed the evening events will commence.

#### **Possible stations:**

Patrols should prepare for Fire Building, Survival Shelter Building, Knot Tying, First aid, Ice Rescue, Basic Scout Knowledge Trivia Questions, Orienteering, Plant Identification, Search and Rescue, Toxic Flood: A chemical plant above the dam has blown up. Patrols have seven minutes to secure their sleds at least as high as their shortest Scout, Blindman Obstacle Course, and Cooking (for lunch on Saturday). (These are tentative and subject to change). Our Alpha Phi Omega – Phi Epsilon Brothers, and other volunteers will be manning each station.

**\*\*Opportunity to help\*\*** Any Troop Leaders/Scoutmaster who would like to staff an above-mentioned station or have suggestions for different stations (preferably ones they'd be willing and able to assist us with) are encouraged to contact us. As always, we

welcome input that would help better the event. If individuals have credentials to sign-off merit badges or partials that could be done during the course of the weekend, let us know.

**Upon arriving to MMA:**

Troops bringing trailers are asked to park in the Public Works lot (indicated in black to the left of the Logan Alexander Fieldhouse on the campus map). Other vehicles can park in the athletics lot between the football field and practice field.

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**Monetary:**

**Regular registration (postmarked on or before January 30th)**

The cost for Friday night arrivals (includes Saturday breakfast) is: \$ 35/person  
The cost for Saturday morning arrivals (Saturday breakfast excluded) is: \$ 30/person

**Late registration (postmarked after January 30<sup>th</sup> or on-site registration)**

The cost for Friday night arrivals is: \$ 40 / person  
The cost for Saturday morning arrivals is: \$ 35 / person  
Race day (Saturday) registration \$ 40 / person (can't guarantee a patch)

**The prices listed apply to both Scouts and Leaders (or other attendees).**

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*Please fill out the enclosed registration forms for your Troop/Crew and each Patrol and return them to us as soon as possible. Make checks payable to Alpha Phi Omega – Phi Epsilon. **Troops should keep a copy of medical forms for each Scout on hand in the event of an emergency throughout the weekend. These do not need to be turned in to APO personnel.***

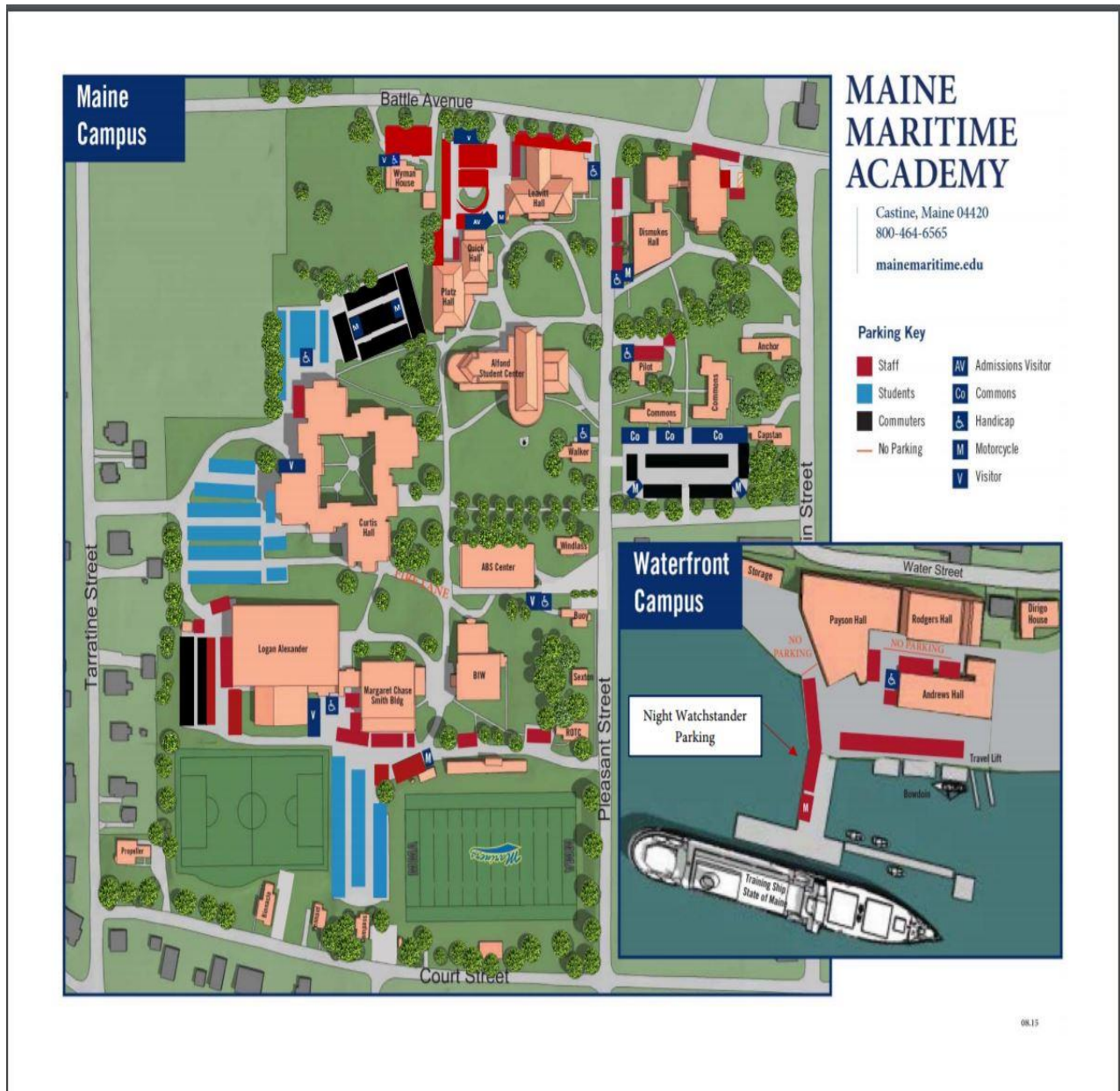
