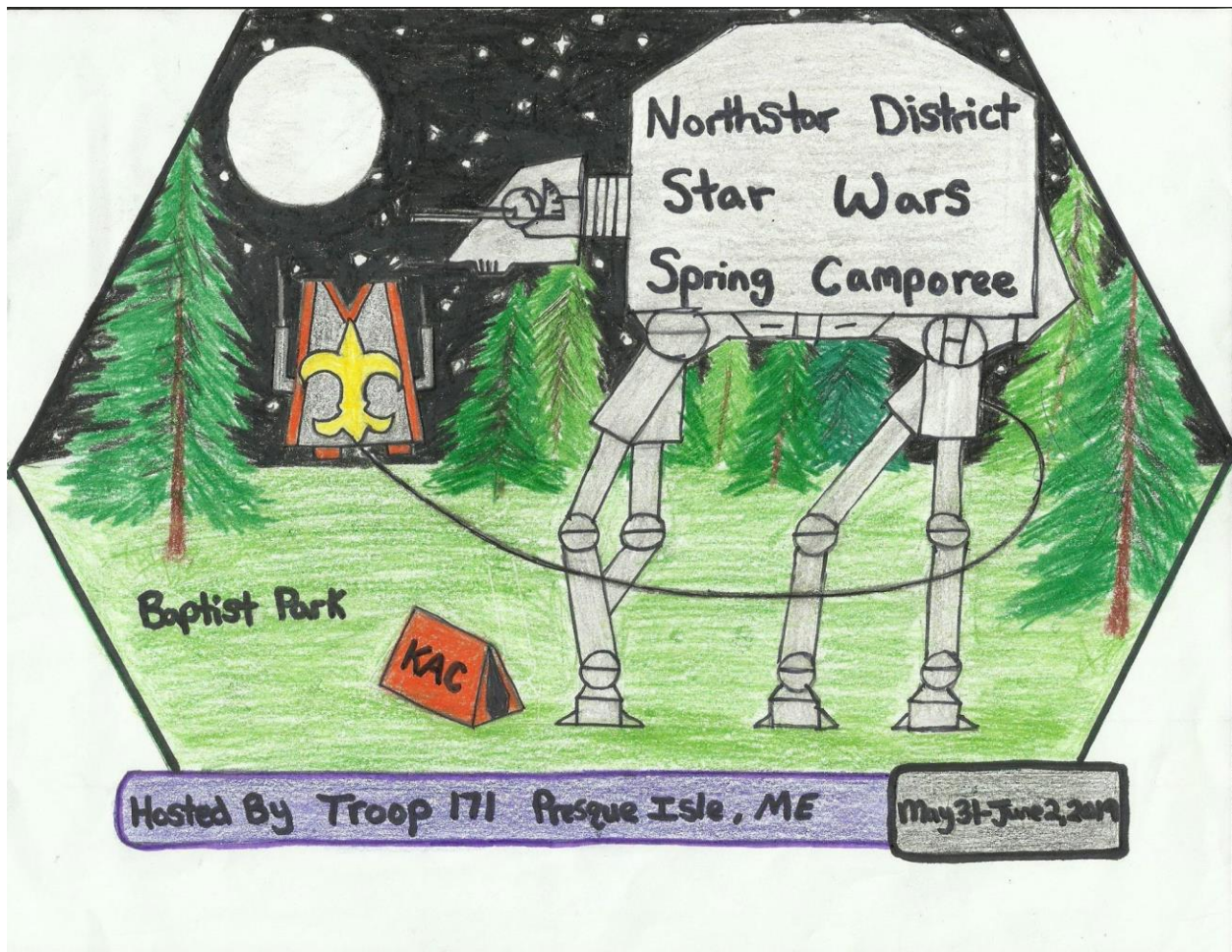

The Spring Camporee theme is "Star Wars". We are looking forward to an exciting weekend of scout skills, good sportsmanship and fun.

All units need to submit their troop roster, and registration fee per boy at the camporee headquarters at time of check in. Each scout who participates will receive a camporee patch. Troops will receive awards for events and awards for campsite inspection and overall performance.

Our registration cost will be \$10.00 for the weekend and include the Spring Camporee patch.

We will be having a Star Wars Cake bake competition. Bring your own ingredients and bake and decorate a cake with a Star wars Theme. Cakes will be judged for best Star Wars theme. You will get a mystery ingredient. Once the cakes are judged you can take them back to your campsite to enjoy.

Camping for all units will be down in the RV Park Camping Area. There will be a designated parking area. Units will be allowed to leave Troop trailer in campsite area.

CHECK IN

Check in begins at 3:30 pm on Friday, May 31 2019

Please bring the following items to check in:

- A copy of your roster of boys by patrol and adults in camp (form attached).
- Camporee fees payable to Katahdin Area Council.
- Medical health forms for every scout and scouter (to be shown only).
- A POSITIVE attitude and ready to have fun!!

CAMPOREE POLICIES

Come to have fun, live by the Scout Oath, Scout Law and Outdoor Code.

The Scout Oath and Scout Law will guide all activities, events and individual behavior.

The Outdoor Code and the rules of low impact camping shall be observed at all times. Each troop needs to bring their own fire pit and firewood.

Each unit should have their campsite boundaries defined.

Each unit should have the entrance to their campsite defined with some type of troop display.

Restrooms: Restrooms for Males and Females will be available on site.

Trash: Each troop will be able to use the dumpster on the way out.

Water will be available at various locations for dishes and we encourage units to bring drinking water with them as the water may not be tested before the camporee!

The Spring Camporee will be held rain or shine.

Senior Patrol Leader Planning Checklist:

Prior to the Spring Camporee:

- Boys and adults informed about the registration fee.
- Troop and Patrol duty rosters created.
- Equipment needed for the event is prepared, conditioned and ready.
- Transportation to and from the event is arranged.
- Place and times of departure and return is arranged.
- Campsite layout is designed.

Upon arrival at Spring Camporee location:

- Unit is checked in by an adult. All outstanding fees are paid.
- Equipment is unloaded at your camp site.
- Campsite set up tasks are delegated.
- SPL, JASM and Scoutmaster attend Cracker Barrel meeting.
- SPL briefs PL after Cracker Barrel meeting about any program changes.

- Campsite is taken down. Equipment is packed.
- Campsite is policed for litter. Everything is returned to its original condition.
- Troop is checked out by Camporee staff.

_____ Onsite manufactured gateway constructed of poles/ lashings. 4 pts

_____ U.S. flag and Troop flag properly displayed. 3 points

_____ Campsite layout shows Patrol method in use. 4 points

_____ Tents pitched to avoid water runoff, potential blow downs. 5 points

_____ Tents secured for bad weather or if weather nice, open and ventilated. Inside appearance of tents orderly. 3 points

_____ Recycling of cardboard, cans, bottles, etc. evident. 4 points

_____ Duty roster and menu posted. 2 points.

_____ Campsite decorated with a Star Wars Theme 6 Points

_____ Extra vehicles parked in campsite area (Minus 2 points for each vehicle)

_____ **2. Scout safety. 40 points maximum**

_____ Adequate drinking water available at all times. 10 points

_____ Tents and vehicles a safe distance from fire minimum of 50 feet. At least one fire bucket per tent. 10 points.

_____ Leaders have access to Scout medical information. New medical form in use with permission to treat available for each Scout at event 10 points.

_____ First Aid kit properly equipped and readily available in site. 10 pts

_____ **3. Camp site Health and Safety. 65 points maximum**

_____ Campfire has burn barrel or equivalent in use. Nothing flammable within safe distance 50 feet minimum. Filled water buckets available. 10 points.

_____ If propane used, tanks and hoses are secure and protected. 10pts

_____ Provisions made for hand washing, soap/water available. 5 points

_____ Dish washing system evident with 3 container system. 10 points

(Wash container, rinse container and sanitize/bleach container)

_____ Food properly stored to avoid animal problems & spoilage. 10pts

_____ Designated chopping area is clearly marked. 5 points

_____ Axes and saws secured, sheath in place. 5 points

_____ Waste water and grease sump pit in use with filter to catch particles. 5 points

_____ Site clean, no litter obvious. Plan in place for carry out trash. 5 pts
