## Camp Weeks and Fees

### Cub Scouts

Small & Tall	July 29 – 31, 2021
Resident Week 1	August 1 – 6, 2021
Resident Week 2	August 8 – 13, 2021

Program	Early Bird Fee	Regular Fee

### Important:

**Scout fees must be paid in full two weeks prior** to the Unit's attendance or a \$25 per Scout late fee will be assessed to the "Regular Fee."

**To receive the Early Bird Fee** – Scout fees must be paid in full by April 15, 2021

**Campership applications** must be submitted on or before April 15, 2021, and will be considered Early Birds. Talk with your Leader about this opportunity.

**Cub Resident Camp is a 6 day, 5 night adventure for Wolves, Bears, Webelos and Arrow of Light.**
